## **Empowering Wellness in the Language Arts Classroom**



#### Purpose:

· Enhance social and emotional well-being

### What you need:

- #LikeAGirl commercial
- #LikeAGirl Writing Prompt worksheet

#### Directions:

- 1. Begin with students answering the two "before video" questions.
- 2. Watch the #LikeAGirl commercial.
- 3. As soon as the video is over, ask students to complete remaining questions on the front page.
- 4. After students have had a sufficient amount of time to write, give students the opportunity to discuss in pairs or as a whole group (or both).

#### Things to think about:

- 1. Challenge students to be honest and thoughtful with their answers.
- 2. Discuss other commonly used terms that may be unkind, disrespectful, or rude (i.e. "that's gay, you're so blonde, etc...). This has the potential to lead to a powerful discussion.
- 3. As kids share personal experience, encourage them to be honest and thoughtful.
- 5. The final prompt (on the back) is an opportunity for students to share how he or she was impacted by the commercial, writing prompts, and class discussion.
